

STORYHOUSE Who we are...

Storyhouse is a charity. Our home in Chester incorporates a library, theatres, an independent cinema, a restaurant, and is a community and creative social space.

Each year we run over 2,000 sessions for marginalised communities, including our vibrant festivals co-curated with our communities, including Storyhouse Queer, Storyhouse Childless, Storyhouse Women, Kaleidoscope for learning disabled and neurodiverse adults, the Chester Literature Festival, and WayWord children's literature festival.

Our theatres present a mix of Storyhouse Originals (produced by us in-house) and the best of the UK's touring work, including comedy, musicals, music, workshops and talks. Beyond Storyhouse, we produce Grosvenor Park Open Air Theatre in the city's park and Moonlight Flicks open-air cinema. Storyhouse's cinema screens 3 films a day, handpicked by us in partnership with many of our communities.

Our library has the longest opening hours of any UK public library, welcoming over eight thousand visitors a week. Everything we do is designed with our audiences and creative communities, creating a vital social space in the heart of Chester for everyone.

STORYHOUSE Purpose of the role

As a Creative Learning Practitioner, you will plan, deliver, and evaluate weekly workshops as part of Storyhouse's thriving partner schools' programme, and deliver sessions with a variety of Storyhouse Youth Theatre groups, with children aged between 5 and 17 years old.

You will work with 3 schools on a regular basis, delivering regular workshops based around Storyhouse's programme and the schools' curriculum.

Your workshops in schools and at Storyhouse will foster a fun and inclusive environment, affording the young people the opportunity to develop a variety of skills, build confidence, work creatively and collaboratively with other young people, and learn from creative professionals.

This role will suit those with substantial experience delivering creative learning and performing arts for young people, ideally within formal education.

The role will be based at 3 different schools, 1 half day per week each, and 2 days based at Storyhouse, Chester.



STORYHOUSE Responsibilities & accountabilities

Main responsibilities

- Plan and deliver weekly sessions for local partner schools, delivering in 3 schools each week.
- Facilitate sessions for a variety of age groups of Storyhouse Youth Theatre.
- Work half a day per week from Storyhouse on planning, resourcing, and preparation.
- Create and direct performances and creative responses with each school, to be presented at Storyhouse Festivals throughout the year.
- Meet with teachers from our partner schools at the start and end of term to plan sessions based around the term's curriculum.
- Meet with the Schools and Education Manager at the start and end of term to plan sessions based around the programme at Storyhouse.
- Share learning, plans, and adjust work to remain consistent with Storyhouse objectives.
- Support the progress of young people in both schools and Youth Theatre.
- Work with, and support, Storyhouse staff/actors who deliver workshops/assemblies to the students.
- Encourage and create pathways for schools to engage in other Storyhouse activities.
- To ensure a safe working environment for all participants.
- Assist with the design and delivery of partner schools' experiences at Storyhouse, including workshops, tours, and performances.
- Plan and deliver creative learning opportunities across Storyhouse.
- Plan and deliver other youth projects through school holidays.

STORYHOUSE

General

- Comply with all company governance and policies, to avoid risks and minimise company liability.
- Follow the Storyhouse Safeguarding procedure, relaying any child protection issues or concerns, and the steps that you have taken, to the Schools and Education Manager and Designated Safeguarding Lead.
- Undertake any other relevant duties as may, from time to time, be required by Storyhouse.
- Provide mentoring support to young people supported by Storyhouse.

Candidates must also be willing to complete an enhanced DBS and obtain a chaperone license.
