

Captioned Films Cinema

Captioning is a service for hearing-impaired or deaf people. Storyhouse provide caption subtitled screenings of films when possible. These screenings have a transcription of the film's dialogue in English along the bottom of the screen and a description of the sound in the film is also included in these captions.

Note that caption subtitling has to be produced by the film distribution company and that unfortunately, not all films have this feature.

Caption Subtitled screenings are usually every Monday, for both the morning screening (usually around 11am) and the early evening screening (usually around 6pm).
